HINTS FOR FILLING OUT THE PROMISSORY NOTE

Please Print All Information!

Description: Make it clear, interesting, tantalizing, wild-sounding, funny. Most of us will jump at a chance to buy something new!

Dates: Provide dates for events. If you cannot be exact, reduce the uncertainty by narrowing it down to "a Saturday afternoon in June," for example.

Minimum Bid: Please list the minimum you will accept. State if it is per person, per family, per dish, per lesson, per series of six lessons, etc. Also note the maximum quantity of people, lessons, food items, etc.

Fair Market Value: We are required by the IRS to give buyers of goods and services a written statement of the value and the amount they can deduct as a charitable contribution. Do your best to estimate what you are offering would sell for in the marketplace.
